Requirements:

- 1-3+ years of development, construction, planning, or permitting experience, ideally in real estate (prior experience in renewable energy is a plus).
- Familiarity with various facets of the solar project development process (land, interconnection, permitting, and construction).
- Resourceful and accomplished research skills - the ability to effectively utilize publicly available materials.
- Ability to succinctly communicate and summarize complex issues into actionable deliverables.
- Driven, resourceful, and comfortable working in an entrepreneurial environment.
- Rigorous attention to detail, work ethic, personal responsibility, work product ownership, and organizational skills.
